

Bee Keeping

In Rwanda's ongoing "Together We Rise" story, beekeeping at Umutara Deaf School has become a vital lifeline for deaf students, thanks to the partnership with Bees Abroad UK. Through this vocational course, students gain valuable skills, graduating as confident, trained beekeepers ready to support themselves and their families. For many deaf students, beekeeping is more than a craft; it is a symbol of independence and self-reliance. It is a doorway to opportunity in a world that often overlooks their potential. Through this unique vocational course, students receive hands-on training, honing their skills and developing an expertise that empowers them to thrive both professionally and personally.

Graduates of the beekeeping program are not only well-trained beekeepers, but they also carry with them the pride of knowing they can provide for themselves and their families. Upon graduation, these remarkable young individuals are equipped with essential tools to launch their beekeeping ventures: bee hives, smokers, bee suits, gloves, and knives - the instruments that symbolize their journey from student to skilled beekeeper.

Kayonza Deaf Blind School

"Since its inception just two years ago, Kayonza Deaf blind School has been a beacon of change and possibility. Despite the fact that deaf blind education is still new and unfamiliar in Rwanda, what once seemed impossible in the eyes of many is now becoming a reality.

> Two years ago, Kayonza Deaf blind Centre opened its doors with a vision that many believed was impossibleoffering specialized education to deaf blind students in Rwanda, a concept still unfamiliar to most. Yet, this year, we proudly celebrate a remarkable milestone: 17 students have successfully completed their Middle Class and are preparing to enter their final year of Kindergarten, which begins in September 2024.

This progress would not have been possible without the unwavering support of our partners, especially JICA, whose collaboration enabled us to train three additional teachers in deaf blind education. One of these teachers, Niyonzima Jean Marie Vianney, shares his personal testimony after completing the training:

"These training sessions were incredibly important to me, especially as I was the first teacher to join Kayonza Deaf blind School after being transferred from Umutara Deaf School. I had very little understanding of deaf blind culture and education. I remember feeling lost, unsure how to teach such unique individuals, as my experience was only with deaf students. But through these training sessions, I learned the power of Tactile Sign Language. Now, I know that teaching deaf blind students requires touch, allowing them to feel the shape of my hands. This approach has completely transformed how I teach, helping me connect with my students in ways I never thought possible."

The dedication of teachers like Niyonzima and the resilience of our students inspire us every day. However, we recognize that there is still much to learn. Deaf blind education remains a new and evolving journey in Rwanda. We earnestly call upon individuals, institutions, and experts in deaf blind education to reach out and offer their support. Any contribution, no matter how small, will profoundly impact the lives of these children and their families.

With each passing day, we witness remarkable progress at Kayonza Deaf blind Centre. Barriers are being broken, perceptions are shifting, and hope is being restored. Kayonza is more than just a school; it is a testament to the unvielding power of resilience, compassion, and the belief that no challenge is too great when we work together.

Special thanks to **DeafReach UK**, we were able to finish the long-awaited main dining hall. Initiated in 2021, this project faced significant delays due to financial constraints. However, with renewed funding from DeafReach in March 2024, construction resumed vigorously, and we are excited to see the hall come to life.

This new facility will provide our students with a dedicated space to enjoy meals, attend school events, and participate in fun activities that foster a sense of community. Transitioning from classroom dining to a designated dining hall is eagerly anticipated by both students and staff, Promising a more organized and enjoyable mealtime experience while improving

the overall school atmosphere.



Elevanie USA Trip

Elevanie, Vice President and Co-Founder of FHR, recently embarked on a significant journey to Portland, Oregon, where she attended a women's conference with a clear mission: to share the story of Friends of Handicap in Rwanda (FHR) and to showcase the transformative work we are doing for the deaf, deaf blind, and vulnerable children of Rwanda. This trip was more than just a conference; it was an opportunity to shine a light on the resilience, hope, and potential that so many children in Rwanda possess, despite the immense challenges they face.

During her various presentations, Elevanie passionately emphasized the vital importance of deaf and deaf blind education, programs that are reshaping lives at schools like Kayonza Deaf blind Centre and Umutara Deaf School. She highlighted the critical role that the Child Education Sponsorship program plays in breaking the cycle of poverty for countless children in Rwanda.

"In the heart of Rwanda, there are countless children whose potential is stifled by the harsh realities of poverty," Elevanie shared with the audience. "These are children with dreams as vast as the sky, but their circumstances have placed insurmountable obstacles in their paths. Despite their families' best efforts, poverty is a relentless force that traps them. Special Needs Education

Our Special Needs Education program consists of two special needs education schools under our management, where this were the first program since 2006.

80 students completed their vocational courses that we do offer at Umutara Deaf School.

30 primary school students completed their primary level studies with completing the Government primary leaving examination.

> 60 home visits were conducted by Child Welfare Officers.

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•7 20 teachers both at Umutara Deaf School and Kayonza Deaf blind School were trained about deaf education.

Our educational sponsorship program provides vulnerable children in Rwanda access to education through school fees, scholastic supplies, and support services, empowering them to break free from the cycle of poverty and realize their full potential.



15 Students are currently sponsored in our program.

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FHR has been advocating for the rights of children who are deaf and deaf blind disabled, focusing on protecting them from violence and discrimination within families and communities.

250 parents, medical care practitioners, financial institutions people were trained on how to take care of people who are deaf and deaf blind disabled for a better services to them.

20 student health visits were facilitated by community nurses





The story behind Child Education Sponsorship Program

In the heart of Rwanda, there are countless children whose potential is stifled by the harsh realities of poverty. These are children with dreams as vast as the sky, but their circumstances have placed insurmountable obstacles in their paths. Despite their families' best efforts, the cycle of poverty is a relentless force that keeps them trapped. Rwanda, a country that has made tremendous strides since the tragic events of the 1994 genocide, still bears the scars of its past. Many families live in rural areas where access to quality education is a luxury they simply cannot afford. The government, though committed to improving education, faces immense challenges due to limited resources and a high demand for basic needs.

For these children, education is not just a pathway to a better life—it's a lifeline. It's the key that can unlock opportunities and break the cycle of poverty that has gripped their families for generations. But the truth is, many of these families cannot afford to keep their children in school. They struggle to provide even the basics like food, shelter, and clothing, let alone school fees, uniforms, and books.

We believe that every child deserves the chance to reach their full potential, regardless of where they were born or the circumstances they were born into. By connecting children with sponsors from around the world, we're able to provide them with the education they desperately need.

The answer lies in the global community we share. While these children's families are rich in love and resilience, they lack the financial means to support their education. And while the government is working hard to improve the education system, the needs are vast, and the resources are limited.

A sponsorship from someone in Poland, USA or any other part of the world, represents hope. It's a bridge between two worlds—one where the opportunities are abundant and one where they are scarce.
